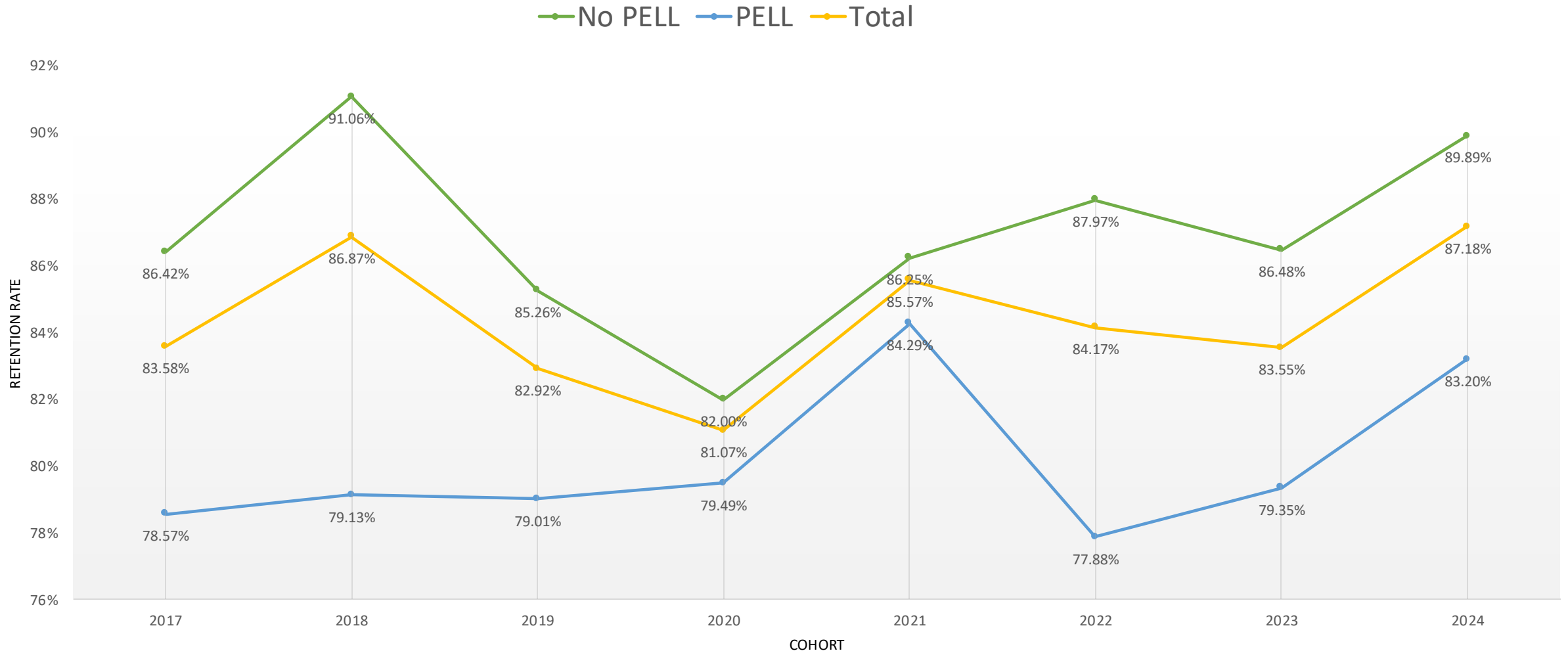

Retention rate is defined as the percentage of first-time, full-time, bachelor's degree-seeking undergraduate students from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the current fall.

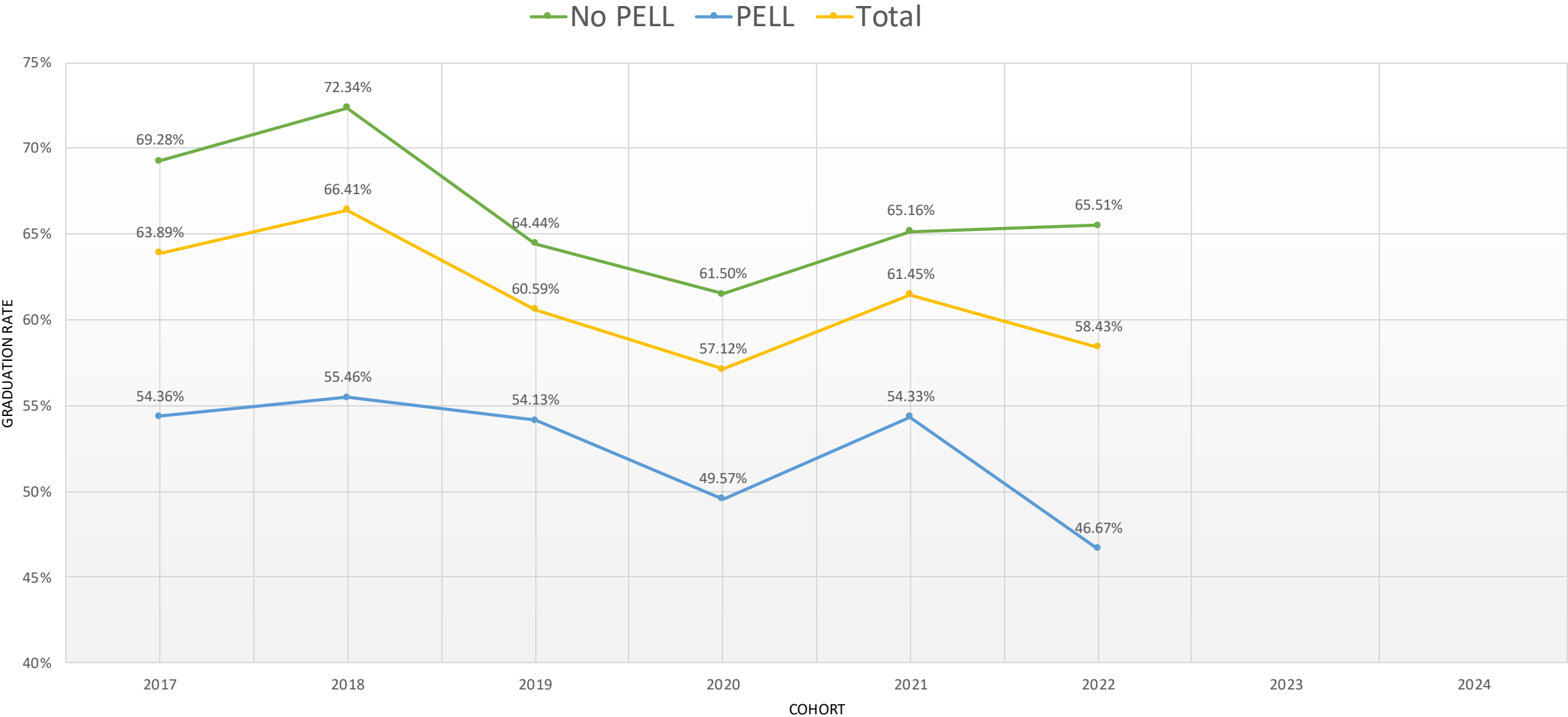
Graduation rate is defined as the percentage of first-time, full-time, bachelor's degree-seeking undergraduate students who completed their program within 4, 5, or 6 years.

Retention and graduation rates are categorized as: 1.) Students who received a Federal Pell Grant; 2.) Students who did not receive a Federal Pell Grant; 3.) All students regardless of financial aid.

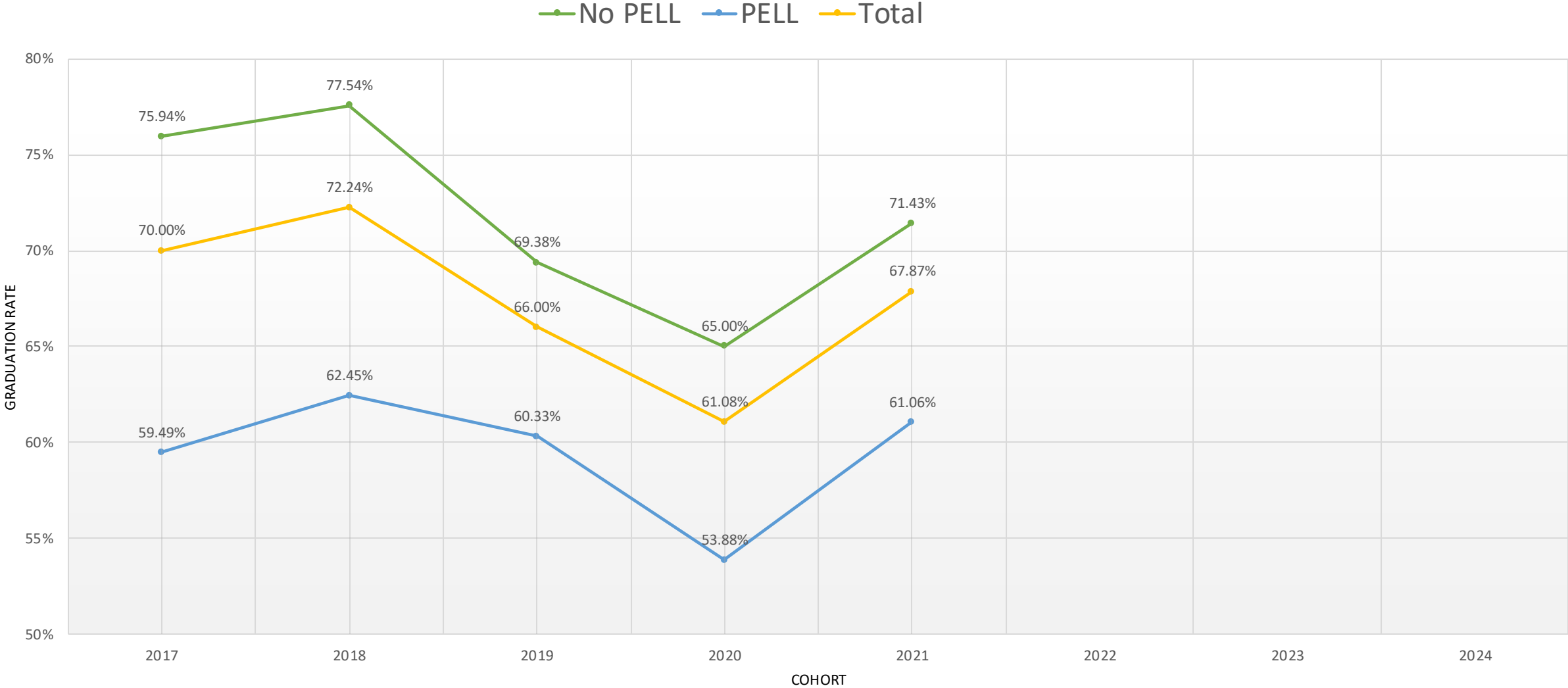
Retention By Pell Status
